



Dr Meda Andrijauskienė (social sciences, economics, Kaunas University of Technology) has more than ten years of research experience in the effectiveness of EU investments, national innovation capacity, and energy economics. She is an associate professor and vice-dean for research at the School of Economics and Business at Kaunas University of Technology. She serves as a member of the advisory group on the European Innovation Council at the Research Council of Lithuania (*Lietuvos mokslo taryba*, LMT), an LMT application evaluation expert, and a reviewer for scientific journals. Dr Andrijauskienė has led or participated in four international and national research projects. She is actively engaged in science communication and public education delivering public lectures, contributing to mentorship programmes, and providing consultations at hackathons. With co-authors she has published 23 articles, including 11 indexed in Clarivate Web of Science and Scopus. In 2022, she became a laureate of the competition for best research works by young scientists and doctoral students held by the Lithuanian Academy of Sciences. During her doctoral studies, she was twice awarded the LMT scholarship for academic achievements. Dr Andrijauskienė has completed research internships at the CERTH Research Centre in Greece and the Centre for European Integration Studies (ZEI) at the University of Bonn, Germany. She has delivered over ten oral presentations at international scientific conferences. As a member of the organisational and scientific committees, she contributed to the organization of the ‘Baltic Management Development Association’ and ‘IEEE European Technology and Engineering Management’ international conferences. Dr Andrijauskienė emphasises the importance of internationalisation, interdisciplinarity, and cross-sector collaboration in research, as well as the open access of research results. She is a certified OpenAIRE Open Science instructor.
