



Dr. Rūta Ubarevičienė is a human geographer and sociologist, a researcher at the Institute of Sociology at the Lithuanian Centre for Social Sciences as well as at the Department of Urbanism at Delft University of Technology. Dr. R. Ubarevičienė is one of the most productive researchers of the Institute of Sociology, conducting globally relevant research on the topics of sociospatial change, social inequality, residential segregation, and housing. R. Ubarevičienė has defended two doctoral theses: in 2017 in the Netherlands (urban and regional studies) and in 2018 in Lithuania (sociology). She co-authored five monographs, 40 scientific publications, gave more than 30 presentations at conferences, co-edited the compilation of open access publication (“Urban Socio-Economic Segregation and Income Inequality: A Global Perspective”, Springer 2021), which was downloaded by over half a million readers. Rūta is an organizer, content creator, teacher and instructor of a Massive Open Online Course (“Building Inclusive Cities: understanding urban inequality and segregation”). She is also an organizer of the online seminar series (“Unforeseen influence: how early simplifications in urban models came to shape theory and practice”). Rūta is actively involved in the preparation of applications and the implementation of international and national research projects. She has extensive experience in scientific cooperation with top foreign research centers: she has done internships and worked in the Netherlands, Germany and Estonia. She is an expert of the European Commission. R. Ubarevičienė’s achievements were recognized by the Lithuanian Academy of Sciences Young Scientists Scholarship (2021–2022), and the Research Council of Lithuania - doctoral scholarships for academic achievements (2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017).
